Our family has been living and serving in Mongolia for 12 years, 6 of which have been spent running the New Roots coffee shop and overseeing a church in the small village of Khatgal.

We have a heart to see churches planted and run by Mongolian believers and recently Milga, a young man who moved his family from Ulaanbaatar to intern with us in the village, let us know that he was feeling led to stay on as pastor of the church here in Khatgal. We are thankful this need is being filled and plan to mentor, train, and transition him into the leading pastoral role over the next two years. We will be praying during that time for direction regarding where the Lord would have our family move to start our next work. This involves both ministry and work visa decisions, so prayers are much appreciated.



We are currently raising funds to open a branch in the state capital of Murun within the next 6 months. The new coffee shop will also have a bookstore; in addition to reading books, it will provide printed discipleship materials to the churches and believers in our state. 
Spiritual Needs:

We are continuing to help the Nationals reach their own people with the Gospel and to build their own church buildings. Currently, over 100 churches are established in Malawi and Mozambique since beginning work there in 2000. Each church is pastored by a trained Pastor in the Bible. We have 16 full time Missionaries who are all nationals. Our goal is to continue this process in the 67 countries which we work in until Jesus comes.







Grace Church in UB is experiencing both spiritual and numerical growth. God has been growing the men to take a stand and lead the church. Pastor Goncho is really coming into his own as pastor. He loves God and loves people and wants to see men and women come to Christ and have a deep relationship with God. Zac is leading Pastor Goncho and several other church leaders in an in-depth Bible study, walking them through Genesis all the way to Revelation. Please pray that these men and women will continue to be hungry to study and understand God's Word. Please pray God will give Zac the wisdom to teach His Word well. Whitney has been faithfully serving at the Ballinger's Feeding Center, homeschooling the children, and organizing special projects for the Manna orphanage, feeding centers, homeschooling group, and Sunday school classes. Please pray for Whitney as she serves in these ministries and homeschools the children.

Naraa's adoption paperwork is still held up at Mongolian Immigration. Despite the efforts of finding an American agency willing to come and provide a home study, there has been silence from Immigration with the organization. Once our work visa is renewed at the beginning of January, we will have our lawyer approach them and ask them what we can do to finalize Naraa's adoption. We know that they have extorted people for money in the past, so perhaps that is what they will do. Please pray for us to have wisdom and continued patience in this situation. Please pray for Naraa, as she is eight years old and asking more questions about the situation. Please ask God to help us to be able to reassure her that God is good, and He is hearing our prayers.

Please pray that we able to raise some money for a vehicle that we can take out to minister to the Gobi churches. They need to be visited more often, and an off-roading vehicle would help this to become a more regular occurrence. Please pray for our church in the Gobi at Saihan Ovoo. They have outgrown their 5 wall ger and are needing a 10 wall ger or a small building for church. They are going to start saving money for it and we have asked that all our other churches do the same. Please be in prayer for both physical needs.

Spiritual Needs:


Prayer for patience as I wait on the Lord's timing for things in my life and also perseverance as this internship can be very tiring at times

I help keep the residents on schedule and crisis-counsel if any is ever needed.

I'm currently working toward getting my Association of Certified Biblical Counselors certification and plan to go back to Boyce to graduate with my Associate's Degree.







We have been busy ministering here in Prestatyn. We have had visitors that seem very likely to stay. One lady came because we hosted a Christianity Explored outreach in another village. She got saved out of witchcraft and some really dark things. It's amazing to watch how Jesus is transforming her life. We are also hosting another Christianity Explored in our house starting the first Thursday in November. We have a teen that has been coming with his family for a while and is interested in learning more about Jesus. Mary is hosting her annual Ladies Crafting event and this year we're handing out 1200 wrapped New Testaments. Pray those will reach people who are seeking the Lord.

As any church, the more people that you minister to the more ways Satan attacks. We have a young lady named Jenny who has started attending our services and is interested in Christianity Explored. She is addicted to some very strong drugs and struggles with staying sober. She stated that every time she seeks Jesus, she winds up back in her old life. Since we have no option but hosting in our house there is always the concern over the safety of our family. We know God will protect us, but please pray that Jenny will be able to stay completely sober through Jesus.

We are also renewing our visa in the last steps of getting indefinite leave to remain in two years. The visas cost just over \$15,000 and we have only raised just over \$5,000. We know God is bigger than our needs. Please pray that we will raise the full amount so we can continue to work here in Wales.

- Pray for us for wisdom, discernment, opportunity to spread the Gospel, protection from spiritual attacks, and strength to stay the course.



- Pray for the Burkinabe to give their lives to Christ even amidst the terrorism that is ravaging the country.



She also has a Bible study during her class. Pastor Boukarie has a large chicken house where he can grow chickens, sell eggs and sell chickens. He also has a small building to sell products like rice, soap, etc.

Unfortunately, terrorism is still spreading and quickly engulfing the entire country. So many people have been affected, including some of our pastors. Many people have had to flee their homes and many lives have been lost. But God is still working in the churches there. Pastor Samuel has had new people coming, people giving their lives to Christ, and people still coming to a Bible Study about what Christianity is. The Gospel is still changing lives in Burkina. Please pray for Burkina.



The downtrodden come to church seeking food to fill their hunger bellies and find food for the soul and a peace that passes all understanding in addition to their physical needs being met.

- Pray for more church members to be equipped so that they can help in the disciplining of the many new/young Christians in our church.


This has been a year of many blessings for our church. We have seen three people baptized and recently three more people began confessing and following Jesus.

Hello again from the Rogers' family in Nicaragua. We are very grateful for your continued partnership in the Gospel ministry. Since last year, much has changed. If you remember, last year we unexpectedly had to leave the country for a few months due to civil unrest and violence. 

CREATIVE ACCESS

"The rulers, elders and teachers of the law called them in again and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus." (Acts 4:18)

There are countries where it is not possible for an expatriate (or foreign) missionary to get a visa. There are countries where church activities are greatly restricted and some countries where open evangelism by Christians is completely prohibited. Churches in areas where they have to meet in secret are sometimes referred to as Underground Churches. Some people have been tempted to think these countries — many of which have Islamic governments — are unreachable. While fulfilling the Great Commission in those countries can be challenging, it is not impossible. Closed to missionaries does not mean closed to the gospel, and that's where the phrase "creative access" is utilized. The following missionary families serve in Creative Access Nations around the world and so information about them is sensitive.

16 WAYS TO PRAY FOR MISSIONARIES

1) Pray that they would be confident in God's Word (Acts 13:4–5)

Missionaries are sent not just to learn culture or do humanitarian relief but to confidently proclaim the Word of God.

2) Pray that they would be filled with God's Spirit (Acts 13:6–9)

Believers already have the Holy Spirit in them, but at times the Spirit fills someone in a special way to enable him or her to proclaim God's Word.

3) Pray for their victory in spiritual warfare (Acts 13:10–12)

When our brothers and sisters take the gospel into the nations, they are going into a war. The devil is dead set on destroying souls and diverting mission.

4) Pray for their success in gospel witness (Acts 13:12)

Pray that many would come to know Christ in all walks of life from the faithful witness of our missionaries.

5) Pray for peace with other believers (Acts 13:13)

Satan attacks from all angles, both inside and outside. Pray for peace within families, in marriages, with children, and with companions and ministry partners.

6) Pray for favor with unbelievers (Acts 13:14–15)

Nonbelievers are blind to the gospel, and many are violently opposed to its message. Pray that missionaries would find favorable opportunities to share the gospel with them.

- 7) Pray that the gospel will be clear through them (Acts 13:16–47)
 - Although cross-cultural communication is difficult, pray that missionaries, by grace, would clearly communicate the character of God, the sinfulness of man, the sufficiency of Christ, the necessity of faith, and the urgency of eternity.
- 8) Pray that God will open hearts around them (Acts 13:48)

God alone draws people to himself. Pray that he will open hearts and minds to believe and be drawn to eternal life with Christ.

9) Pray for their joy in the midst of suffering (Acts 14:1–2)

Missionaries often face various forms and levels of suffering in their work. Pray that they would experience the joy of intimacy with Christ in the midst of it.

10) Pray for their kindness in the midst of slander (Acts 14:1–2)

Though missionaries face suffering and difficulty, pray that the character of Christ and the power of his Spirit enable them to respond with grace.

11) Pray for supernatural power to accompany them (Acts 14:3)

Pray that missionaries would speak the Word with boldness and that supernatural power would accompany its proclamation.

12) Pray for Christlike humility to characterize them (Acts 14:4–18)

Pray that missionaries would overcome the temptation to be prideful in their work by the power of the Spirit.

13) Pray for their patience (Acts 14:8–18)

Missionaries face ups and downs and wins and losses in their work. Pray that they might respond with longsuffering.

14) Pray for their perseverance (Acts 14:19–20)

In 2 Corinthians 4:8–9 Paul wrote, "We are . . . struck down but not destroyed." Pray for missionaries to persevere through setback after setback, beat down after beat down, and struggle after struggle.

15) Pray that God would use them to make disciples (Acts 14:21–23)

Pray that missionaries would see fruit in their ministries as they seek to make disciples among the nations.

16) Pray that God would use them to multiply churches (Acts 14:24–28)

Pray for the multiplication of churches filled with people who know the Word led by pastors who teach the Word.
